TOWN OF EATON LOCAL LAW NO. 6 OF 2025

Councilmember Verne introduced proposed Local Law No. 6-2025, titled "A Local Law to Amend Chapter 120 of the Code of the Town of Eaton to Consolidate and Create a Board of Appeals and Planning Board and to Abolish the Existing Board of Appeals and the Planning Board," which Local Law consolidates and creates a new seven member joint Board of Appeals and Planning Board in the Town of Eaton, which was seconded by Councilmember Hilts, to wit:

WHEREAS, Volume 6 N.Y.C.R.R., Section 617 of the Regulations relating to Article 8 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law, requires that as early as possible an involved agency shall make a determination whether a given action is subject to the aforementioned law; and

WHEREAS, no other agency has the legal authority or jurisdiction to approve or directly undertake the enactment of a local law in the Town of Eaton; and

WHEREAS, an EAF has been prepared and has been reviewed by the Town Board; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has considered the adoption of said Local Law, has considered the criteria contained in 6 N.Y.C.R.R. Part 617.7 and has compared the impacts which may be reasonably expected to result from the adoption of said Local Law against said criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that the enactment of proposed Local Law No. 6-2025 is an unlisted action, there are no other involved agencies and this Board shall act as lead agency in this matter for purposes of SEQRA review; and it is further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, the Town Board has determined this action involves procedures to process land use and subdivision regulations, has no direct impact on the environment and will have no adverse impact on the environment; that accordingly, an environmental impact statement (EIS) shall not be required; and that this resolution shall constitute a negative declaration under SEQRA; and it is further

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that the Town Board conduct a public hearing as to the enactment of proposed Local Law No. 6-2025 at the Eaton Town Offices located at 35 Cedar Street in the Town of Eaton on December 9, 2025 at 6:05 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, at which time all persons interested in the subject shall be heard.

The Town of Eaton will accept sealed bids for the purchase of diesel fuel for use by the Town of Eaton Highway Department from January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2026.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR FUEL BID:

The sealed bid is for an annual use of approximately 14,000 gallons of diesel fuel. Storage capacity is 2,000 gallons in an above ground tank. April through October deliveries will be #2 low sulfur Diesel of approximately 6,000 gallons. November through March deliveries will be a minimum 60% (#2)/40% (#1) blend of approximately 8,000 gallons.

Selected supplier will also provide 87-octane gasoline with an annual use of approximately 2,000 gallons for a 500-gallon aboveground tank.

Sealed Bid must include rack price for #2 Low Sulfur Diesel, #2/#1 Blend, and gasoline on the bid date, differential, fluctuating net price, and if applicable, an annual firm net price for each product.
